

What is FamilyLinQ?

FamilyLinQ school communities are welcoming, caring and safe places focusing on improving life outcomes for children and their families

A collaborative initiative between **school communities**, **Qld Government** and **The Bryan Foundation**.

- First two sites Kingston State School and Corymbia State School.
- Qld Gov construct buildings and other required infrastructure
- The Bryan Foundation manage and operate the community hub in partnership with the school and the local community (10 years)



Strategy and Planning.....

- First Nations culture, and other cultures, will be acknowledged through artworks, artefacts and other physical symbols.
- The Hub will have the right people so that people will want to stay and be comfortable and have a cup of tea on a bad day.
- Families will have opportunities to share their stories. Everyone has a story, and this will be known by the Hub staff, with 'stories being known' as a marker of success.
- Activities for families will be convenient and accessible so families will be able to come to things regularly, for example appointments.
- The hub will be a place to learn and ask questions, and to share knowledge, stories and experiences among school community members and to build positive relationships.







This artwork represents the communities of Kingston coming together, respecting the land, honouring our Ancestors and working as one.

The top elements are our Ancestors looking over us, our lands and waters with the rise and fall of our sun.


The middle combined elements are the representations of our trees, leaves, waterways, walking tracks and animals.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags are the centre piece to show respect to the Traditional Owners of the lands in which we reside.

The elements beside the flags are the tracks, hurdles and footprints we make to bridge Country to Community.

The bottom Yarning Circle represents the Kingston community yarning and coming together to communicate and learn from one another.

The dots throughout the art piece represent the footprints we make and leave behind for our future generations.





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
